HOUSING AND SERVICES FOR THE HOMELESS

Marian House | 949 Gorsuch Ave., Baltimore

Housing and support services for homeless women and children, including counseling, case management, addiction treatment, family reunification, educational services, employment assistance and placement, and life skills training. Permanent housing programs include:
