HOUSING AND SERVICES FOR THE HOMELESS

Catholic Charities offers a range of programs:

- **Christopher Place Employment Academy**
Intensive residential program providing education, training, and recovery support to formerly homeless men of the Baltimore area
- **Earn Benefits**
Screening program for public benefits and financial assistance
- **Project Promise**
Permanent individual housing for homeless people with disabilities
- **Project FRESH Start**
Helps eligible homeless families find stable, affordable housing

St. Vincent de Paul Society

- **Family Pathways** | Shelter diversion and homelessness prevention program serving 75 families per year

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

St. Vincent de Paul Society programs include:

- **Parish-based outreach in District 45** | St. Anthony of Padua, Most Precious Blood, Shrine of the Little Flower, and St. Francis Xavier parish societies provide food, utility and rent assistance, and other support to help people through difficult times
- **Caroline Center** | 900 Somerset St.
Job training to prepare un- and underemployed women in Baltimore City to become certified nursing assistants, pharmacy technicians or construction workers
- **Good Harvest Community Kitchen** | 1901 62nd St.
Provides fresh, nutritious meals to children in the Baltimore area
- **Good Harvest Food Service Training Program** | 1901 62nd St.
Full-time food service training course that combines classroom instruction with hands-on experience

Catholic Charities provides a range of services, including

- **Family Support Groups**
Support groups for families who have a member with mental/behavioral health challenges.

- **Gallagher Services**
Extensive resident, employment, respite care, and other supports and services for adults with developmental/intellectual disabilities
- **Level Up** | Helps youth, 18-24, with specific obstacles, to find and keep employment
- **SHARE Food Network**
A community-based organization open to all, offering groceries at a discount, through high-volume purchasing and volunteer support

Parish-based volunteer ministries provide a range of outreach services for the community and city, such as food collections/donations for inner city churches, prepare meals for Beans and Bread soup kitchen, and are active in programs such as Meals on Wheels.

FAMILY, CHILD AND HEALTH SERVICES

St. Vincent de Paul Head Start Programs

Comprehensive pre-school education program designed to prepare low-income children for academic success

- **Head Start Somerset** | 1012 Somerset St.
Located in former Ss. James and John School; the \$3 million fully renovated building is an investment in East Baltimore
- **Head Start Caroline** | 1427 N. Caroline St.
- **Early Childhood Mental Health Screening**
Behavioral consultation, mental health referral and treatment services for those participating in Head Start and Early Head Start Head

Catholic Charities offers a range of programs for residents:

- **Home-Based Respite Program**
Professional staff provide therapeutic opportunities for children with mental health challenges, while also giving a break to the caregiver
- **In-Home Intervention Programs**
Intensive in-home intervention to empower families, divert children from hospitalization or residential treatment, and maintain children in their homes
- **Mental Health Assessment Team**
Mental health assessments for children entering the child welfare system in Baltimore City
- **Villa Maria Behavioral Health** | Mental health and substance use disorder treatment to adults, children and families, in-home respite services, and public school partnerships.
