HOUSING AND SERVICES FOR THE HOMELESS

Marian House | 949 Gorsuch Ave., Baltimore

Housing and support services for homeless women and children, including counseling, case management, addiction treatment, family reunification, educational services, employment assistance and placement, and life skills training. Permanent housing programs include:

- **Serenity Place** | 932 Gorsuch Ave.
14 one-bedroom and 5 two-bedroom apartments
- **Independence Place** | 4101 Old York Rd.
10 one-bedroom and 12 two-bedroom apartments

Catholic Charities programs available to residents include:

- **Christopher Place Employment Academy**
Intensive residential program providing education, training, and recovery support to formerly homeless men of the Baltimore area
- **Project Promise**
Permanent individual housing for homeless people with disabilities
- **Project FRESH Start**
Helps eligible homeless families find stable, affordable housing

St. Vincent de Paul Society

- **Family Pathways** shelter diversion and homelessness prevention program serving 40 families per year

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

The Franciscan Center | 101 W. 23 St. | 400-600 meals daily, plus Dignity Plates Training Academy and Dignity Plates Catering. Helps promote self-sufficiency: state IDs and birth certificates, clothing, eviction prevention, dental and vision, SNAP, mail & prescriptions

- **Gallagher Services** | Residential, employment, respite care and other services for adults with developmental/intellectual disabilities
- **Level Up** | Help youth (18-24) with obstacles find and keep employment

Legal services; health care; education, employment, food & housing assistance regardless of legal status, ethnicity or religious affiliation

Community-based organization open to all, offering groceries at a discount, through high-volume purchasing and volunteer support

HEALTH CARE AND RELATED SERVICES

Catholic Charities provides a range of services for residents, including:

- **Early Childhood Mental Health Screening** | Behavioral consultation, mental health referral and treatment services for Head Start and Early Head Start children and families
- **Family Support Groups** | Support groups for families who have a member with mental/behavioral health challenges.
- **Home-Based Respite Program**
Professional staff provide therapeutic opportunities for children with mental health challenges, while also giving a break to the caregiver
